Nano Nagle's charism is particularly significant to us at Mercy Partners as the Presentation Sisters of Queensland entrusted to our care their education ministries – St Rita's College, Brisbane and St Ursula's College, Yeppoon.

St Rita's College hosted the book launch. We had a fabulous night exploring the resource and honouring Nano Nagle. Mary Franzmann powm, the Congregation Leader of the Queensland Presentation Sisters expressed how Presentation People "are grasping the baton, standing up and seeking ways to develop and nurture Presentation leadership and charism." We hold steadfast and firm to the task entrusted to us to "Keep the Lantern Burning" and invite you to join us in doing so too.

We filmed the event (watch here), which included a welcome and introducation by Dr Ricki Jeffery, a moving testimony by Sr Mary Franzmann pbvm – this heartfelt and beautiful testimony is a delight to watch and is a true call to us all to preserve, nurture and reimagine the Presentation Charism in our place at this time. We concluded with an address by Dr Caroline Thompson, who compiled and wrote the resource book. Caroline took the time to walk us through the resource and to express the reality that a single book cannot hold every detail but it can aid and support you to "Keep the Lantern Burning."




Acknowledgement of Country

Accreditation undertaken across all Mater facilities and services by the Australian Council of Healthcare Standards (ACHS) has resulted in an excellent outcome with all Mater sites passing accreditation. Key areas of exceptional practices noted by the assessors included: Launch of patient journey board in Outpatients Department; and established process for day of admission elective surgery COVID rapid antigen testing (Brisbane); Planning for implementation of Sozo machine to assist in breast care treatment (Rockhampton); Introduction of new risk assessment forms with collaboration between Clinical Safety and Quality and Mater Education on bedside teaching of staff; and significant reductions in returns to operating theatre and re-admissions after surgery (Townsville); arly transition to home – supporting public patients who wish to discharge within 12 hours of baby's birth; and a project to initiate immediate skin to skin contact for elective caesarean births (Mater Mothers).







