#### THE PROCESS OF THE CONVERSATION METHOD

The Conversation or Discussion Method of facilitating a shared understanding is used when a group is faced with details which can impact on a decision.

## Step 1: FACTS

The facilitator focuses the participants on a set of facts or figures such as the list of factors impacting the global Catholic Church in John Allan's book.

Consider what other sociocultural issues impact on the expression of the Catholic faith in Australia today?

# Step 2: FEELINGS

The facilitator asks the participants what their reactions are to the material presented.

What worries you about the material from John Allen? How do you respond to information regarding global change?

# Step 3: MEANINGS

The facilitator invites participants to consider the meaning of these changes for their lives and the ministries in which they work.

How will these changes impact on the work of the ministry in the next 5 to 10 years?
Which are the most serious challenges for this

# Step 4: ACTIONS/ DECISIONS

community?

The facilitator invites participants to suggest one or two immediate actions to address the issues raised in the conversation.

Are there new directions which this group needs to take?

### Finish with a prayer

Come, Holy Spirit!
