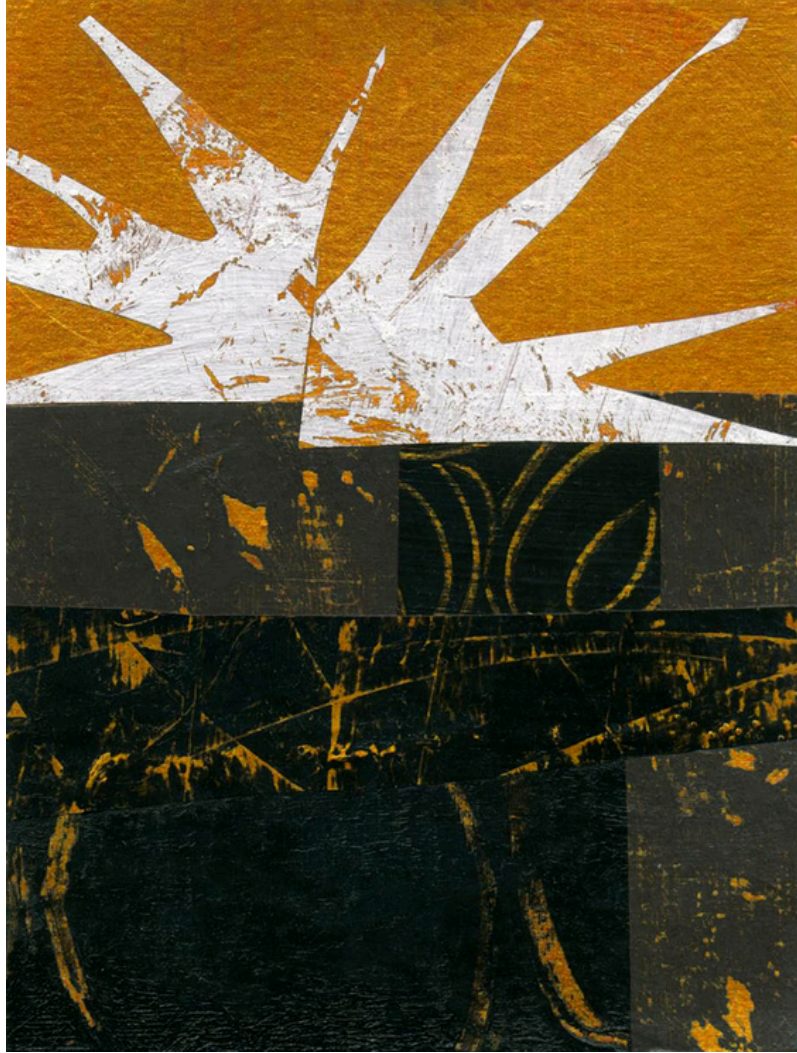


Easter Triduum 2026

John 19:18
